2.1 The Organising Committee of The World Games 2025 Chengdu (TWG 2025 Chengdu LOC)

On 1 November 2023, TWG 2025 Chengdu LOC was established, with Minister of the General Administration of Sport of China and Governor of Sichuan Province as the Presidents, leaders of the General Administration of Sport of China, Sichuan Province and Chengdu Municipality as Vice Presidents, and Mr WANG Fengchao, Mayor of Chengdu, as the Vice President and Secretary General.

2.2 The Executive Committee of TWG 2025 Chengdu (Chengdu ExCo)

In March 2024, upon the approval of TWG 2025 LOC, Chengdu ExCo was established as its executive entity, with Mr WANG Fengchao, Mayor of Chengdu, as the President, executive leaders of Chengdu as Vice Presidents, and Mr XU Xingguo, Vice Mayor of Chengdu, as the Vice President and Secretary General. Chengdu ExCo consists of the following 10 departments in charge of the preparations for TWG 2025 Chengdu: General Affairs Office of Chengdu ExCo, Department of Discipline Inspection, Auditing and Legal Services, Department of Workforce Management (Volunteer Services), Department of Logistical Support, Department of Sports (Doping Control), Department of External Liaison, Department of Media (Opening and Closing Ceremonies), Department of Transportation and Security, Department of TWG Village, and Department of Urban Affairs and Services.

2.3 Venue Clusters and Venue Operations Centres (VOCs)

According to the venue distribution and the administrative divisions of Chengdu, eight Venue Cluster Committees have been established, the Tianfu New Area Venue Cluster Committee, Eastern New Area Venue Cluster Committee, Hi-



tech Zone Venue Cluster Committee, Jinniu Venue Cluster Committee, Wuhou Venue Cluster Committee, Longquanyi Venue Cluster Committee, Xindu Venue Cluster Committee, and Jianyang Venue Cluster Committee. Under these Venue Cluster Committees, there are a total of 22 VOCs set up, namely, the Xinglong Lake Hubin VOC, Xinglong Lake Beach VOC, Tianfu Park VOC, Chengdu Sport University Ball Games VOC, Chengdu Sport University Water Sports and Flying Disc VOC, Chengdu NO.7 High School Eastern Campus VOC, Sancha Lake Water Sports VOC, Eastern New Area Foot Orienteering VOC, Tianfu International Hotel Billiards Sports VOC, Hi-tech Zone Wushu and Powerlifting VOC, Hi-tech Zone Ball Games and Flying Disc VOC, Chengbei DanceSport VOC, Sichuan Softball VOC, Sichuan Gymnasium VOC, Dong'an Lake Indoor Sports VOC, Dong'an Lake Outdoor Sports VOC, Qinglong Lake Archery VOC, Longquan High School Korfball VOC, Xiangcheng Floorball VOC, Chengdu Roller Sports VOC, Jianyang Polo VOC, and Jianyang Cultural and Sports Centre Gymnasium VOC.



3.1 Logo

On 17 May 2024, the International World Games Association (IWGA) and Chengdu ExCo officially released the logo of TWG 2025 Chengdu. The logo design is inspired by the Chinese giant panda, hibiscus flower and Chinese knot, with Chinese Red, Jinsha Yellow, Park Green, Panda Black and Snowy White as the main colours. As an important symbol of TWG 2025 Chengdu, this logo effectively conveys the Olympic spirit and highlights the traditional Chinese elements and the characteristics of Chengdu, highlighting the values of "Unity, Inclusiveness and Diversity".



The unveiled logo boasts vibrant hues and a minimalist design: the semicircular perimeter intertwined with a pattern of triangles elegantly frames a blooming hibiscus flower. Five colourful geometric blocks ingeniously form the faces of four cartoon pandas.

The Logo's composition draws upon the form of the Chinese knot, an ancient handmade craft that symbolises unity, prosperity, and good fortune with its myriad shapes, akin to a Rubik's Cube woven from cords. The semicircles mimic panda ears while also serving as geometric hibiscus petals. Each of the four symmetrical sections presents a panda's face.





In early April, the review and selection meeting was convened in Chengdu, where 23 renowned designers, senior experts, scholars, and researchers, including HAN Meilin, senior professor of arts from Tsinghua University, and QIAN Zhe, BIL Division Chief of Beijing 2008 Summer Olympics, assessed the shortlisted designs and narrow down to ten finalists. Following further professional refinement, five candidate logos were chosen for a public vote.

The five-day voting campaign attracted over 100,000 participants, with a total of more than 220,000 likes. The logo, which was inspired by the hibiscus flower, the giant panda and the Chinese knot and designed by John Fairley, secured the top spot with 55,679 votes, making it the crowd favourite. After joint review by TWG 2025 Chengdu LOC and IWGA, the logo was officially unveiled.

3.2 Slogan

The slogan "Boundless Sports, Countless Wonders" implies that in Chengdu, a land of promise, tradition and modernity coexist in harmony, the fast pace of a metropolis and the slow life of the residents form a delightful contrast, the leisure and easiness on every street and lane and the competing essence of sportsmanship echo each other, and sports, like a dazzling spark, ignite the infinite potential and possibility of this city, making happiness prevail in this land of countless wonders.

Among the 3,749 designs solicited from home and abroad, we found evident similarity. Many designs integrate the fighting spirit of sports with the charm of Shu culture. Some designs share the same vision and inspiration. Taking "sports vibes, Chengdu flavours, and international communication" as the key idea, upon the agreement with the IWGA, the Executive Committee of TWG 2025 Chengdu finally selected "Boundless Sports, Countless Wonders" as the slogan of TWG 2025 Chengdu after several rounds of review and discussions, with input from parties of interests and experts. This slogan is widely representative and highly accepted by the public.

"Boundless Sports" implies the infinite possibility of sports spirit, which encourages every athlete to challenge themselves and transcend the limit, and "Countless Wonders" shows the harmonious integration of "fast and slow" and "traditional and modern" lifestyle in Chengdu,





hoping that guests from all over the world can also feel for themselves the unique life philosophy and human care of Chengdu in their spare time.

The slogan of TWG 2025 Chengdu embodies the world's love for sports and recognition and affection for Chengdu. It represents not only collective wisdom, but also shared perception and aspiration. It is a thriving force supported and accepted by the public, vividly interpreting Chengdu's passion for sports and attitude towards life.

3.3 Mascot

The mascots of TWG 2025 Chengdu are "Shu Bao" and "Jin Zai", with the two treasures of Sichuan, i.e., the giant panda and Sichuan golden snub-nosed monkey, as the prototype. The giant panda is the best-known animal of Chengdu, and the Sichuan golden snub-nosed monkey is full of vigour and vitality. These two treasures are expected to showcase the image of Chengdu as a liveable and hospitable city and call on everyone to cherish rare animals and protect biodiversity.

The names of the mascots are inspired by "Shu Jin" (Shu brocade), with "Shu" and "Jin" as the first word of the names, respectively. The second word of each name captures the nature of giant panda and the Sichuan golden snub-nosed monkey. The giant panda is known for its loyalty and integrity under its cute and fluffy look and is therefore named "Bao" (meaning "baby"). Sichuan golden snub-nosed monkey is smart, brave, and bouncy. So, it is named "Zai" (meaning "young child").

"Shu Bao" and "Jin Zai" give expression to Chengdu's unique charm. As the ambassadors for cultural exchange, these two treasures will start from Chengdu, and embark on a journey to tell the story of Chengdu worldwide and make the message from Chengdu heard by the world. They will bridge Chengdu and the world, so that the spectators from across the globe can enjoy the sports festival held in Chengdu while savour the city's infinite vigour and boundless glamour.







4.1 TWG Twelve Monthly Fairs

TWG Twelve Monthly Fairs, launched in January 2024, focusing on the 35 sports of TWG 2025 Chengdu and aiming at diversified experience activities participated by all people, multi-channel popularisation of TWG sports, and multi-aspect promotion of Chinese culture. So far, six Monthly Fairs covering experience activities of 14 sports of TWG 2025 Chengdu have been well planned and conducted, and a fair in the shape of TWG Logo has been organised in the combination with elements of intangible cultural heritages and folk customs, attracting nearly 300,000 visitors. These activities have been reported by more than 60 media at all levels, including People's Daily, Xinhua News Agency, and China Media Group (CMG), and IWGA's official website, and the related topics have been viewed for more than 20 million times on the Internet.



The Monthly Fair of January, titled with "Friendship Fair", was held in Guixi Park on 27 and 28 January, providing experience activities on the sports of tug of war and archery, and an exhibition match of korfball participated by the invited national beach korfball team and the citizens.







The Monthly Fair of February, titled with "Joy Fair", was held at the 53rd Chengdu International Panda Lantern Festival in Tianfu Joy Park from 10 to 24 February, i.e., the 1st day to the 15th day of the first month in the Chinese lunar calendar, providing experience and science-popularisation activities on the sports of sambo, kickboxing, and powerlifting, and inviting visitors to enjoy the TWG lantern groups and guess the TWG lantern riddles.





The Monthly Fair of March, titled with "Challenge Fair", was held at Danjingtai on 24 March, recruiting citizens to participate in foot orienteering as experience officers. Along the orienteering routes, participation-recording sites were set with interesting experience activities of boules sports, disc tug of war, Cuju (ball-kicking), and kite flying provided.









The Monthly Fair of April, titled with "Running Fair", was held in Chengdu SKP on 21 April, inviting parkour world champions to support the Parkour experiencing adults and children, and providing experience and exhibition activities involving TWG sports such as FPV drone racing and boules sports.







The Monthly Fair of May, titled with "Dance Fair", was held under Jiaozi Twin Towers on 25 May, staging dancesport show with Latin dance and standard dance, providing open dancesport classes for the citizens, inviting trampoline world champions to lead the Trampoline experience activities and assessment experts to interpret the logo of TWG 2025 Chengdu on the site, and providing experience activities on TWG sport of floorball, as well as intangible cultural heritage activities such as the ball game Budaqiu and lacquer fan making.









The Monthly Fair of June, titled with "Boat Fair", was held in Huanglongxi Ancient Town on 1 and 2 June, providing experience activities on TWG sports of Canoe (including dragon boat and kayak), and powerboating (motosurf), organising a fair in the shape of the TWG Logo and inviting citizens to participate in intangible cultural heritage and folk experience activities such as sachet making and paper dragon boat folding. On the occasion of Children's Day, entertaining activities such as water gun archery and mini billiards and interactive performances such as puppet shows and clown magic shows were presented to all children.







The Monthly Fair of July, titled with "Water Fair" was held safely and orderly in Chengdu Polar Ocean Park and closed at 16:00, 28 July 28, providing exhibition, performance and experience activities on the sports of freediving, life saving (pool) and freestyle-inline, as well as a fair in the shape of the TWG logo, TWG 2025 Chengdu themed exhibition, ancient-style handicraft bracelet making, and colourfilling of TWG 2025 Chengdu logo on umbrella.



4.2 Publicity and Media Coverage

Since October 2023, nearly 100 media outlets at all levels, including People's Daily, Xinhua News Agency and China Media Group, made intensive interviews and reports on major events and milestones of TWG 2025 Chengdu, such as the 1st Competition Managers Meeting and CoCom Meeting, the Global Promotion and Fun TWG Experiences for All Campaign, TWG Twelve Monthly Fairs, and the solicitation and release of the logo, slogan, and mascot of TWG 2025 Chengdu, producing a total of nearly 15,000 relevant reports, thus creating a favorable atmosphere of public opinion.



On 2 February, the headline news entitled "Sports Economy Stimulates Consumption Potential" was released on the Business Column of the People's Daily, covering the friendly matches under the Fun TWG Experiences for All Campaign and other warm-up activities as the starting point. Spotlight news titled "TWG is Coming", "Logo of TWG 2025 Chengdu Officially Released" and so on were reported in Evening News, Sports World, Sports Express and other brand columns of CCTV. In addition, Xinhua News Agency, China Daily, China News Service and other media released a number of news, coverages on the Friendly Matches under Fun TWG Experiences for All Campaign Launched in Chengdu, Embracing the New Year with Sports, Attracting Visitors by Friendly Matches under Fun TWG Experiences for All Campaign.

Short videos such as "TWG 2025 Chengdu, Leap to Infinite" have been produced and released. The official social media matrix of TWG 2025 Chengdu has launched a series of TWG themed posters. A series of interactive activities on the theme of New Year Greetings from Panda, as well as themed posters and WeChat red packet covers, have been launched on domestic and foreign social media platforms, with more than 20 million participants in total.

4.3 One-Year Countdown Ceremony

A series of celebrations of the one-year countdown of TWG 2025 Chengdu were held from 6 to 11 August 2024 in Beijing, Hong Kong, China, and Chengdu.

On 6 August, the Press Conference of One-Year Countdown of TWG 2025 Chengdu was held in Beijing. At the conference, representatives of Sichuan Province and Chengdu Municipality updated the preparations in terms of sports organisation, venue construction, and cultural activities and released the slogan, mascot, official apparel, and licensed products of TWG 2025 Chengdu, which were covered by nearly 30 media at the central, provincial, and municipal levels. On the same day, The World Games Chengdu-Hong Kong Tour themed train bound for Hong Kong West Kowloon Railway Station was launched from Chengdudong Railway Station, carrying Sichuan-born Olympic champions, Roller Sports athletes, entrepreneurs from Sichuan and HK, Sichuan Opera artists, intangible cultural heritage inheritors, Sichuan cuisine business owners, and museum exhibition guides to HK for the promotion of TWG 2025 Chengdu on occasion of the one-year countdown.





On the afternoon of 7 August, Chengdu-Hong Kong Tea Party, an activity under the One-Year Countdown of TWG 2025 Chengdu, was hosted at sky100 Hong Kong Observation Deck. At the Party, the Executive Committee of TWG 2025 Chengdu signed a strategic cooperative agreement with the Sports Federation and Olympic Committee of Hong Kong, China, a sponsorship agreement with Xtep Group Co., Ltd., and a low-altitude economy intention agreement with FYUAV (Shenzhen) Co., Ltd. The marketing plan of TWG 2025 Chengdu was also published, inviting domestic and overseas companies to join TWG 2025 Chengdu as TWG partners, to share opportunities afforded by TWG 2025 Chengdu, and to seek industrial growth.





On the evening of 7 August, the One-Year Countdown Ceremony of TWG 2025 Chengdu was staged at the International Friendship Pavilion of the main venue of the International Horticultural Exhibition 2024 Chengdu in Chengdu Eastern New Area. At the event, Chengdu



invited friends from across the world to participate in TWG 2025 Chengdu under the slogan of "Boundless Sports, Countless Wonders". IWGA President José Perurena delivered a speech through video in which he praised the effective and excellent work of TWG 2025 Chengdu LOC, and stressed his firm belief that Chengdu will present The World Games in a successful, splendid, and exceptional manner. The first batch of TWG 2025 Chengdu apparel was rolled out, including those for staff, Games volunteers, city volunteers, technical officials, security staff, and transport staff. At the end of the ceremony, DENG Yawen, a Sichuan-born Olympic champion, athletes from the National Beach Korfball Team, and the resident representatives from all walks of life invited sports enthusiasts worldwide to gather in Chengdu next August and enjoy the grand sports festival.

On 7-11 August, the 5-day TWG Carnival was held in the main venue of the International Horticultural Exhibition 2024 Chengdu for residents and tourists. It integrated sports experience for DanceSport, Floorball, Roller Sports, and Beach Korfball, and carnival events including the TWG Twelve Monthly Fairs and Themed Music Flash Mob Show, and presented these events at 17 performance and experience areas, providing all visitors with immersive experience and marching performance.

During the Paris 2024 Olympics, Chengdu worked with the International Sports Press Association (AIPS), setting up a special session for TWG 2025 Chengdu at the AIPS Centennial Celebration. At this session, the mascot of TWG 2025 Chengdu





made its debut on the international stage. AIPS President Gianni Merlo announced the official launch of The World Games 2025 Chengdu Young Reporters Programme and sending an invitation from Chengdu to the world. Meanwhile, at the Bastille Design Center in Paris, the TWG 2025 Chengdu Day under the Ode to Chinese Sports Spirit Exhibition was hosted by the Chinese Olympic Committee, with mascot photo-taking devices set up on site and small gifts such as brochures and badges of the TWG 2025 distributed to all visitors.




The Main Media Centre (MMC) is the headquarters for media operations, sports broadcast and press release during TWG 2025 Chengdu. It is located in the Western Financial Innovation Center, the core area of the Eastern New Area, Chengdu. This cluster is a built-up area and an office area for financial and headquarters enterprises, equipped with mature commercial service centres, starred hotels and apartments, public libraries, and art galleries.

The MMC covers an area of about 20,000 square metres, consisting of the Main Press Centre (MPC) and the International Broadcast Centre (IBC). The MPC is located in Building 1 (1F and 2F) and the Conference Centre, covering an area of about 11,000 square metres. The IBC is located in Building 7 (1F-3F), covering an area of about 6,000 square metres. In addition, there is a 2,000- square-metres space, mainly used for the construction of the City Hall, where cultural events and interactive activities can be held.





Near the MMC is the recommended media hotel, Grand Mercure Chengdu East. The proximity makes it easy for media personnel to balance work and life during their stay In addition, the MMC is close to Tianfu International Airport, TWG Village, Eastern New Area Venue Cluster, Tianfu New Area Venue Cluster, and Hitech Zone Venue Cluster, and is about 6.5 kilometres away from Chengdu Second Ring Expressway. It is also adjacent to Sancha Station of Metro Line 18. People can go to the Tianfu International Airport and downtown of Chengdu by such convenient means of public transportation.

Doping Control

Doping is strictly prohibited and the organisers of TWG 2025 Chengdu are committed to supporting the work of anti-doping agencies. Testing can and will be carried out at any time in accordance with the *World Anti-Doping Code* and the *WADA International Standards for Testing and Investigations*.

In accordance with the IWGA schedule of providing anti-doping guidelines to the local organising committee, the anti-doping plan for TWG 2025 Chengdu is expected to be released in Bulletin #3 in February 2025.

Medical Insurance

As the insurance partner of TWG 2025 Chengdu is still in the process of selection, the insurance requirements and repatriation policies for participants of TWG 2025 Chengdu will be released in December 2024.
